Our students have scored exceptionally well in the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma results from 2010 are as follows:

- Our average Diploma score was 34 in 2010 (the worldwide Nov 2009 average was 30.97)
- Our top IB score was 44 which is in the top 1% worldwide
- All students are now in first or second year of university
- 30% of our students received an equivalent tertiary entrance rank of 99. (Tertiary entrance rank of 99 = OP1)

University Credit Achieved

- 375 course credits for Griffith University
- 189 course credits for University of Queensland

Queensland Academy for Health Sciences nurtures academic excellence through university partnerships, eLearning innovations and community connections. Students' successes during 2010 include:

- 3 out of the 16 national finalists for the BHP Billiton Science competition were QAHS Students.
 1 QAHS student was awarded 2nd place after a week long camp in Melbourne and was also awarded an all expenses paid trip to Los Angeles, America, to participate in the 2011 International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).
- The 3 national finalists for the Stockholm Junior Water Prize (SJWP) were QAHS Students.

 The QAHS National Winner was awarded an all expenses paid trip to attend the 2011 International SJWP in Stockholm.
- 1 staff member was the state finalist for the BHP Billiton Science Teacher Award.
- Queensland Academies were awarded the Premier's Excellence in Public Service Award Smart Category for 2010.
- 144 QAHS students received awards in the 2010 national CSIRO CREST Award Competition, 11 were Gold, 16 Silver and 117 Bronze. 13 Gold awards were presented nationally this year 11 of those coming to QAHS. In the last 2 years, QAHS has won a quarter, of the 65 Gold Awards presented, since CSIRO CREST Awards begun in 1995. A phenomenal achievement and recognition of how our students are challenging what the norm is, and pushing the boundary of what excellence in education is.
- Three of our students in 2010 were awarded Gold Coast City Council Youth Achievement Awards.
- 2 students participated in the National Youth Science Forum.
- A 2010 Year 12 graduate was awarded a TJ Ryan Memorial Medal and Scholarship at Parliament House in March 2011. There are only 6 of these given each year and our student was awarded the highest award in the set of scholarships issued.
- QAHS results from the Gold Coast Science Competition were 8 x 1st, 6 x 2nd, 4 x 3rd 18 awards in total.
- QAHS results from the Queensland Science Competitions were 5 x 1st, 2 x 2nd & 3 x 3rd 10 awards in total.
- Over 50% of our Year 12 students received a High Distinction in the National Chemistry Competition. An amazing achievement and reflective of the quality chemistry program students are exposed to at QAHS.
- 2 of our students are in the final selection exams for the Australian Olympiad teams of biology and chemistry.
- 1 student and 1 staff member received Peter Doherty Awards for excellence in science and science teaching.
- 11 QAHS students completed the Health Studies Certificate from Griffith University. Results included 4 High Distinctions, 5 Distinctions and 2 Credits.
