This funding will be used to

- Focus on increasing Year 12 IB Mathematics percentage of results for IB 4 or greater from 72.2% in 2019 to 100% in 2020 (reportable in December 2020).
- Focus on increasing Year 11 IB Mathematics percentage of results for IB 4 or greater from 92.8% in 2019 to 100% in 2020 (reportable in December 2020).
- Focus on all Year 10 students achieving a C or greater in pre-IB Mathematics in 2020 (91.4% in 2019, reportable in December 2020).
- Ensuring 100% of Year 12 students awarded an IBD, QCE, VET in 2020 (100% in 2019, reportable in December 2020)

Our initiatives include

- Regularly monitor and respond to student performance data
- Provide extra support for Year 11 and 12 students to achieve 4 and > in IB Mathematics
- Provide extra support for Year 10 students with mathematics learning gaps
- Provide a range of extra support programs and activities focused on improved student outcomes and enhanced parent engagement

Our school will improve student outcomes by

• Supplementing an additional Mathematics teacher to support smaller classes where possible in the timetable	\$30,000
• Providing online Mathematics tutorials support after school	\$38,000
• Supplementing the QAHS targeted Learning and Study Skills Program	\$6,000
• Afford parent seminars and newsletter items facilitated/provided by an external expert focused on supporting students to succeed	\$3,000
• Provide resources to support student wellbeing to succeed as aligned with the Australian Student Wellbeing Framework and Queensland Student Learning and Wellbeing Framework	\$3,000
• Supplement Guidance Officer allocation	\$41,709
