This funding will be used to

- Focus on all Year 11 and Year 12 IB students achieving a 4 or greater in Mathematics Analysis and Approaches and Mathematics Applications and Interpretations in 2022 (84.6% Year 11 in 2021 and 96.5% Year 12 in 2021).
- Focus on all Year 10 students achieving a C or greater in pre-IB Mathematics in 2022 (94.5% in 2021, reportable in December 2022).
- Focus on gathering measurable data for student wellbeing - EPOCH Measure of Adolescent Well-Being (EPOCH) data on a term-by-term basis and Queensland Education Wellbeing Survey.
- Build on the existing referral system for targeted wellbeing strategies by the Student Services Team.
- Engage external expert facilitation of targeted mental health awareness and strategies for mental health support for students and associated parent community engagement in Positive Psychology /Unconditional Positive Regard/Grit wellbeing strategies.

Our initiatives include

- Provide extra support for Year 11 and 12 students to achieve 4 and > in IB Mathematics.
- Provide extra support for Year 10 students with mathematics learning gaps.
- Align QAHS practices and culture with research-based Positive Psychology descriptors (Professor Martin Seligman).
- Regularly gather, monitor and respond to student wellbeing data providing targeted support for students to build on their strengths and to support their wellbeing.
- Provide a range of extra support programs and activities focused on improved student outcomes and enhanced parent engagement

Our school will improve student outcomes by

• Providing online Mathematics tutorials support after school	\$9 600
• Supplementing leadership development facilitated/provided by an external expert focusing on mental health support strategies	\$12,000
• Supplementing the QAHS targeted Learning and Study Skills Program	\$10,000
• Providing parent seminars and newsletter items facilitated/provided by an external expert focused on supporting students to succeed	\$5,000
• Provide resources to support student wellbeing to succeed as aligned with the Australian Student Wellbeing Framework and Queensland Student Learning and Wellbeing Framework	\$3,000
• Supplement Wellbeing Counsellor (Guidance Officer) allocation to join the Student Services Team	\$91 806
